- On the face of it there didn't appear to be too many changes in the step up from U11 to U12, but the biggest hurdle for many of the boys was the difference between school rugby and club rugby. - Starting of the season it was great to see the majority of the boys back after the summer and we were lucky to have a core of regular boys turning up week after week, allowing us to continue to develop and integrate the newer boys into the squad. I am pleased to say, without exception, that all of the newer lads have worked really hard during both training and on match days and have done themselves and their team-mates proud. We have worked hard throughout the season to build a real team spirit within the squad which is beginning to show in the way the boys interact with each other.
- On the playing field it has once again been a very successful season, despite the interruptions by the weather! with the boys only losing 1 match in the regular season. On a positive note, we did play some very good sides for the first time.
- The highlight of the season was undoubtedly the boy's performance at our own OC's festival. The style of rugby played by the boys, in very blustery conditions, was a joy to watch as they passed the ball around, off-loaded in the tackle, interlinked between forwards and backs and generally just kept the ball alive. This resulted in a try count in the region of 14 tries scored and 0 conceded. It was a great effort by the entire squad.
- As is tradition we ended the season with a family tour to the Burnham-on-Sea festival. There was stiff competition in the U12 age group with 17 teams entered. We came top of our pool, winning all of our matches and once again only conceding 1 try. We were drawn against Buckingham in the semi-finals that would turn out to be a closely matched game, which we unfortunately lost by 1 try to nil. Buckingham went on to win the final 25-0. Despite the result, it was a great tour which once again contributed to the building of a real team spirit amongst the lads.
- On a final note we would like to thank all the parents for their continued support, and we will see you all for the same next season.
